The Academic Term

All regular Programs, Courses and Private Lessons run from September to June. There are ~37-39 weeks in the Term and 2 Concerts.

Programs are carefully designed with select *Courses* to support a student's goals. Programs may consist of weekly Private Lessons & Group Rehearsals with performance opportunities. Registering for a Program offers the greatest tuition savings, including 10% off sibling enrollment.

Courses

A course refers to a single discipline Group Class. Courses run seasonally. Fall (October – December); Winter (January – March); Spring (April – June).

Private Lessons

Private Lessons taken in conjunction with a Program offer multiple Solo-Performance opportunities and a refined method or curriculum study. Term Private Lessons include ancillary material to support Program goals at highquality learning. Private Lessons are also offered for casual learning (practical studies only; no Program). Term, Drop-in, Semi-Private options available.

If a new student enrolls for Private Lessons after September and would like to receive the Term discounted tuition rate, they will be enrolled until August ('Extended Term').





1-2 Weekly Group Classes. 3 Performance Opportunities. This program is designed for toddlers and preschoolers and their sponge-like minds! It features a curriculum of classes consisting of music, dance and parent-8-child activities that engage students in games and tasks that instill foundational skills such as rhythm, melody, dynamics and song structure; movement, co'ordination, team-work. These skills are further developed in the Spring group class called Miniature Jamz which incorporates all these learned concepts to prepare children for a unique performance in the June concert!

B: Sparks (ages 6-8 | 9-12 | 13-17)

1-2 Weekly Group Classes. 3 Performance Opportunities. Group B of Music Sparks are comprised of students who have little to no music experience and want to explore a variety of instruments. These students will have weekly group music lessons where they learn music fundamentals including chords, rhythm, dynamics, music terms and song structure. Additionally, students will also be a part of our musical theatre (sing/dance/act) and hip hop courses which teach stage presence, choreography, team-work, co'ordination and memorization. Students will learn and experiment with multiple instruments in Junior / Senior Jamz so they can decide which instrument(s) they gravitate to and want to pursue learning in the next path of our Program Road Map: CW Conservatory, CW Performance, CW Performing Arts.

CW Music Conservatory Program

1 Weekly Private Lesson. 1 Weekly Group Class. 2 Performance Opportunities. The CW Music Conservatory Program teaches the essential elements of musical training and music literacy, while also encouraging students' enthusiasm for music, empowering their artistic expression and celebrating achievements. Students will have an opportunity to perform solo selections in front of an audience in the December and June recitals. Private Lessons focus on learning technique and fundamentals of an instrument of choice. Good practice habits and weekly responsibility become beneficial skills that translate to other life skills. Students will also be a part of a comprehensive and effectively sequenced curriculum of group Music Theory study and assessment, beginning with the Preparatory level(s), followed by level 1 to 10. At each level, a Certificate of Achievement can be earned by successfully

completing a Royal Conservatory practical examination.

CW Triple-Threat

1 Weekly Private Lesson. 1 Weekly Group Class. 3+ Performance Opportunities. The CW Triple-Threat Program explores music, dance and theatre. The program allows students to explore multiple Arts Programs to prepare them for the stage in a "Triple-Threat" (Sing-Dance-Act) performance! Students meet in weekly group rehearsals to refine their skills in dancing, acting/runway to develop stage presence, confidence and co'ordination. Students are grouped by age (kids/tweens/teens). Students will also further develop their skills in weekly Private Lessons to refine their music knowledge in 1:1 vocal or instrument studies. All Performing Arts students meet together in April to prepare a "Triple-Threat" Production that is comprised of singing, dancing and acting. The "Triple-Threat" group will perform in December and June concerts and other venues with an audience. Additionally, each student will perform a solo that they prepared in their weekly private lesson at each concert. The Certificate Program's academic subjects support students in acquiring the theoretical and historical knowledge necessary for **music literacy**. See p. 14 for more details.

CW Music Performance Program

1 Weekly Private Lesson. 1 Weekly Group Class. 3+ Performance Opportunities. The CW Music Performance Program and Performing Arts Program focuses on performance-based music education in a supportive environment. The goal is to get these students ready for the stage! Students meet in weekly group rehearsals to learn and play songs in a rock band setting. Students are often grouped by age (kids/tweens/teens) and are assigned material that is arranged by the Music Instructor depending on a student's experience and current skill level.

Students will also further develop their skills in weekly Private Lessons to go over and focus on mastering the material that they were given in the group rehearsal. Depending on the duration of the private lesson, a teacher may be able to include material outside of group rehearsal including method books and repertoire for solo performances in the December and June recitals. The performance group itself will perform in December, June and other venues with an audience.

Royal Conservatory of Music Certificate Program

Levels 1 – 4 (Beginner) Levels 5 – 8 (Intermediate) Levels 9, 10, ARCT (Advanced)

Practical: These examinations evaluate the performance of repertoire, etudes or vocalises, technical tests, aural skills, sight reading/singing. Prepared in private lessons.

Theory: These examinations evaluate the understanding of building blocks of music, from the basics of notation at the Elementary levels to structural and harmonic analysis at the Advanced levels. Prepared in Group Theory RCM classes.

GROUP MUSIC CLASSES

Rock Band, Mini/Junior/Senior Jamz

Our popular, award-winning Rock Band program is a fun, performance-based class that meets once a week studying pop to rock repertoire. Students play instruments corresponding to their own private-lesson practice and/or experience and collaborate with other musicians. Rock Bands perform in recitals, concerts and events in the lower mainland.

Group Guitar, Group Ukulele, Class Piano

Meeting once a week, students will learn the fundamentals of playing the guitar, ukulele or piano in a group setting. Other than piano students, participants should bring their own practice instrument

RCM Theory Certificate Group: Prep A & B - Level 10 / Theory, Harmony, History A highly recommended course for all students. Students wishing to deepen their music understanding or needing to write a co'requisite Theory or History Exam for the Royal Conservatory of Music can join our group classes.

Class times vary. Each level corresponds with the RCM Exam Dates. This class is automatically a part of our "CW Conservatory Program" (p.8)

Musical Theatre (7-17)

Sing, Dance & Act! Our Musical Theatre class teaches choreography, solo singing and group harmonies while emphasizing technique and performance artistry. Students learn repertoire of ensemble pieces through storytelling, while building confidence. Students will prepare sing-dance-and-act performances for family showcases and/or our annual Winter & June recitals!







COURSES: YOUNG KIDS & PERFORMING ARTS

MUSIC GROUPS AGES 3-6

Ukulele Kids (parent & child duo) is a program that introduces the ukulele and basic theory in a fun, learning environment with both the children and their guardian. The class runs for 30 minutes.

Rainbow Stars (group singing)

This program was named by its own students! Rainbow Stars is a 10 session program that introduces the principles of music through singing songs, playing music games and rhythm. This program is a stepping stone towards private lessons. Parent participation during the session is required. The class runs for 30 minutes.

DANCE

Hip Hop (ages 4-6 | 7 - 10 | 11 - 17)

Dance students will meet once a week in a group setting to learn routines with teachers. Performances will be held in the Winter & June recitals and performance crews will perform in the Rock Band & Performance-Student Concert.

Tiny Bubbles (ages 3-6)

Tiny Bubbles is a group dance program designed to create a fun environment of movement and expression, introduced with basic fundamentals of movement, coordination, musicality and group interaction skills. The students will use self-expression and imagination.

RUNWAY

Learn catwalk and pageant walks, or simply learn to walk confidently in those high-heels!

ACTING

Workshop sessions are seasonal. Students work with a local actor who provides group demonstrations on character building and tips and information on what to expect at casting auditions, film sets and more.

SPRING BREAK & SUMMER CAMPS

Music performance-based camp where students learn in a supportive, fun environment lead by a professional musician. Students perform together as a group on the last day of camp! If you play an instrument, bring it to camp!

The Canadian Association for Music Therapy (CAMT) defines Music therapy as "the skillful use of music and musical elements by an accredited music therapist to promote, maintain, and restore mental, physical, emotional, and spiritual health." (www.musictherapy.ca).

Music therapy is the clinical use of music to accomplish individualized goals such as reducing stress, improving mood and self-expression. It is an evidence-based therapy well-established in the health community. Music therapy experiences may include listening, singing, playing instruments, composing music, or a specialized method by an accredited Music Therapist.

ARE THERE WAYS TO COVER THE COST OF MUSIC THERAPY SESSIONS?

Music therapy is not usually covered by health care and extended health care plans. There are some exceptions, such as Worksafe BC, ICBC and funding for autism.

MTABC is part of the Task Group for Counsellor Regulation in BC. This group is lobbying the BC government for music therapists and other counselors and therapists to be regulated under the Health Professions Act. Once this is approved, it is anticipated that music therapy services will be approved under private insurance plans.

FUNDING FOR CHILDREN WITH AUTISM

The Ministry of Children and Family Development will give block funding to parents/guardians which can cover music therapy for children ages six to nineteen years. Music therapy is called an Autism Related Intervention. The family can choose to have the money placed in their account and then pay the therapist directly, or, have the therapist contact the Ministry and send them invoices. At this time, this service ends when the child reaches the age of nineteen years. For further questions, people can contact the Autism Funds Processing Unit at 1-877-777-3530.

FUNDING FOR HEAD INJURY

Some individuals with a head injury can apply for funding through ICBC if they can show pre-morbidity musical involvement.

OTHER POSSIBLE SOURCES OF FUNDING

Some special needs children may apply for funding through adoption services, and Variety Club and CKNW have been known to fund music therapy, as well. Clients and families usually complete these applications.

Examples Of Music Therapy Goals:

- Because music is fun, music is effective in motivating and engaging individuals with special needs to meet academic, social, and/or physical goals in fun and positive way.
- The examples of music therapy goals include, but are not limited to:
- To provide a safe environment for self-expression and choice-making
- To provide opportunities to release stress physically and emotionally through singing, drumming and the use of other instruments
- To facilitate communication
- To develop/improve social skills
- To help acquire/retain academic information
- To increase attention span
- To improve fine and gross motor skills through the use of musical instruments
- To encourage relaxation and calming
- To reduce feelings of isolation

*It's important to note that music therapy is NOT the same as musical instruction. If the main goal is to build vocal or instrumental skills, you'll need to find an instructor instead of or in addition to a music therapist.

What is The RCM Certificate Program?

The Royal Conservatory Certificate Program (The Certificate Program) provides a recognized **national standard** and sequenced program for people studying music privately, from beginner through advanced levels. (source: RCM Syllabus, 2016)

The RCM Certificate Program is a comprehensive and effectively sequenced program of music study and assessment, beginning with the Preparatory level(s), followed by levels 1 to 10, and concluding with the Associate Diploma of The Royal Conservatory of Music (ARCT). A Licenciate Diploma of The Royal Conservatory of Music (LRCM) is available for piano. At each level, a Certificate of Achievement can be earned by successfully completing a Royal Conservatory practical or theory examination.

At CW Music, our Group Theory class follows the RCM Certifcate Program curriculum as part of our Conservatory Program. See p. 8 for information on our Conservatory Program.





Do I have to follow the RCM Stream?

For Practical (Music) Lessons, our beginner students (Levels 1-4) usually begin with Method Books (no exam).

The Piano Adventures Stream is the most preferred option for beginner piano students. Once a piano student completes Level 4 or 5 of the Piano Adventures stream, they are automatically placed into the RCM stream. See our Piano Curriculum on page and Piano Adventures & RCM Level equivalency on p for more details.

Other instruments use method books and selections by their teacher, however students are welcome to include the RCM curriculum at any time. Students can study a blend of contemporary music and material from the RCM curriculum.

When a student is ready to begin the RCM curriculum, Theory becomes a co'requisite for level certificate completion. It is therefore strongly advisable to start Theory lessons as soon as one takes up private music lessons. This is the mandatory requirement of the RCM for levels 5 and above. The RCM administer the exam, and all exam fees are payable to the RCM.

Who can earn RCM Certification?

All our students can! There are two subjects of certification: Practical & Theory.

Practical: These examinations evaluate the performance of repertoire, etudes or vocalises, technical tests, aural skills, sight reading/singing.

Theory: These examinations evaluate the understanding of building blocks of music, from the basics of notation at the Elementary levels to structural and harmonic analysis at the Advanced levels. Students enrolled in our "Conservatory Program" will be able to prepare for Music Theory Certificate exams.

Practical Exams are prepared for in Private Music Lessons. Theory Exams are prepared for in our Group Theory Classes as part of our "Conservatory Program" (p. 8). Private Lesson and Group Theory Class material are independent of each other and therefore separate courses/exam recognition.



Completion of the Intermediate RCM Certificate Program's examinations can be used for high school credits.







What are the benefits of The Royal Conservatory Certificate Program?

Students achieve a deeper understanding and appreciation of music, allowing for independence and creativity. Students who study music theory become fluent in the language of music. The more fluent, the easier it will be to grasp musical concepts.

High quality: The Royal Conservatory offers a national standard of music education

Scomprehensive: The RCM Certificate Program includes repertoire, etudes, technique, sightreading, ear training, musicianship, and theory.

Well-rounded Structure: The program provides a consistent clear path for well-rounded musical training, and meaningful structure for rewarding excellence.

Recognition of Achievement: Student achievement is recognized at each level through examinations. Students can celebrate their accomplishments and track their progress.

Accredited Assessments: An accredited examiner from the RCM's College of Examiners provides objective feedback and comments which can be valuable in developing the student's skills.

High School Credit: Many high schools recognize RCM Certificate Program examinations for credit toward graduation.

College Application (extracurricular): An impressive addition to any resume – demonstrates musical accomplishments, creativity, a willingness to learn, and the ability to achieve goals.

Students who participate in RCM examinations tend to become **more dedicated** to their instrument and **practice more often.**

Achievement in RCM Certificate Program examinations is an impressive addition to any **resume**. More than just sharing individual's musical accomplishments, it is indicative of their creativity, a willingness to learn, an ability to set both short and long-term goals, and a commitment to achieving difficult tasks.







Music Theory Certification at Every Level

The RCM curriculum is designed to enrich practical studies concurrently by level therefore supporting the study of music theory at every stage of a student's musical development. It encompasses **rudiments, harmony, counterpoint, analysis, and music history,** and has been carefully written to enhance the skills of **aural awareness, analytical thinking, and creativity.**

Upon successful completion of each **RCM Theory Exam Level**, a student will be recognized with a **Certificate from the Royal Conservatory of Music.**


Why should I take a Music Theory program?

Students achieve a deeper understanding and appreciation of music, allowing for independence and creativity. Students who study music theory become fluent in the language of music. The more fluent, the easier it will be to grasp musical concepts.

Theoretical levels are tied to practical (performance) levels, reinforcing concepts encountered in repertoire, technique, and musicianship studies.

Elementary (Preparatory–Level 4)

Elementary students begin their musical journey using these five progressive volumes. Introduction to music notation and fundamental concepts are presented and explored through engaging practical activities and written exercises. Selections from The Royal Conservatory repertoire and etudes books invite students to hear and play a piece while discovering how theory concepts come alive. One *Answer Book* is conveniently available for these levels.

Perfect for students of all instruments, these age-appropriate books introduce the building blocks of the musical language.



Celebrate Theory Chanter

Intermediate (Levels 5–8)

Students continue their musical journey with these intermediate volumes that reinforce theoretical concepts from previous levels and continue to expand musical literacy and build analytical skills. Each student's learning is enriched through interactivity with creative composition, analysis, and music appreciation. Integration of guided listening activities allow for a shared experience between the student and teacher, or student and parents. As with earlier volumes, Royal Conservatory repertoire and etudes are included throughout to help theory concepts come alive and build a strong foundation for well-rounded musical training. One *Answer Book* is conveniently available for these levels.

Advanced (Levels 9-ARCT)

Harmony & Counterpoint and Analysis

Using an interactive approach that builds on the knowledge of basic elements acquired in earlier levels of theory, these books guide students to a deeper understanding of musical vocabulary, syntax, and structure. Three clear and concise volumes that integrate harmony & counterpoint are complemented by a single volume of analysis that synthesizes and connects the study of theory directly to the practical experience.



History

Updated to reflect the requirements in the *Theory Syllabus*, 2016 Edition, these three volumes are essential resources for providing an introduction to and overview of the study of Western music. Through an exploration of styles, genres, and composers and their masterworks from the Middle Ages to the Modern Era, students will cultivate a lifelong appreciation and engagement with music.



SCHOOL POLICY

MISSED LESSONS & CANCELLATIONS

Group classes / Ensembles

There are no make-up classes or refunds for group classes, dance classes, band rehearsals or ensemble rehearsals missed by a participant.

Private Lessons

Tuition is based on enrollment, not attendance, and reserves a weekly lesson time with a teacher during a term. Notification of inability to attend a lesson or therapy session is a courtesy to the teacher/therapist but does not excuse payment. There are no credits or refunds for student absences, nor carry-over into the next term. Therefore there is no reduction in tuition for a missed lesson.

Make-up lessons may be granted, at the teacher's discretion, at no additional charge provided that a notice of absence is given at least 48 hours (2 days) via the "Request to Reschedule Lesson" Form on our **website: www.cwmusic.ca/reschedule.** This is to allow sufficient time to inform your teacher, re-schedule the booking, re-schedule the practice room and schedule another student's make-up session in the time slot that will be missed by you. <u>Text message, voice mail & email will NOT suffice for 48 hours notice – please fill up the online form and preview the teacher's availability for make-up slots.</u>

Please understand that make-up lessons are a courtesy, not an obligation that is offered at the discretion of the teacher, schedule permitting.

"What if I exhibit COVID-19 symptoms on the day of my lesson?" COVID-19 Addendum Missed-Lesson Policy

A lesson can take place on Zoom or any other online platform on the same day as the regularly scheduled in-person lesson in the event that a student develops cold or flu symptoms. 48-hours notice is not required, but notice must be made via our "Request to Reschedule Lesson" Form by selecting "Illness, same day lesson but online" and optionally to the teacher's professional email. If a student chooses to forego remote lessons in place of in-person lessons, and if the teacher is already in-studio or enroute, the teacher is not obliged to make up the lesson.

Instructor Absences

Members of the faculty are active performers in the field. From time to time, their performance schedules may necessitate rescheduling a lesson. If an Instructor is absent, every effort will be made to provide a substitute or make-up lesson at a time that is suitable to both the student and the Instructor. If the Instructor is unable to make up a lesson, the student will receive a refund, or credit to be applied to future lessons or classes. The same policy applies to lessons canceled due to inclement weather.

WITHDRAWALS & REFUNDS

Group Classes / Ensembles


If a student needs to withdraw from a group class up to two weeks before it has started, then any fees paid will be transferred to a school credit. No credits will be issued if a student withdraws from a group class less than two weeks before the start date. If a student's behavior is deemed consistently disruptive to a class, after consultation with the parents, the teacher will have the right to refuse entry to the class and there will be no refund. Minimum enrollment: Group classes and ensembles need to meet a minimum number of enrolled participants to run. Activities may have to be canceled if they fail to meet their minimum number. In this instance, participants will be notified at least one week in advance, and will receive a full refund.

Private Lessons

If a student must withdraw within the first month of a term, 7 days notice must be provided in writing or in email to info@cwmusic.ca. The client will be refunded the amount less their deposit, registration fee and attended lessons that are then recalculated to reflect the drop-in rate rather than the discounted term rate, as the term was not fulfilled. There are no refunds if a student chooses to withdraw 2 months into a term, as the time slot has been reserved for you; however, you may choose to transfer it to another person. If agreeable to the teacher, a student may choose to change teachers & discipline at any time during the term, given fair reason. If provided with written notice at least 2 weeks prior to the commencement of the first session, a client may receive a full refund.

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FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What if I register after September?

The Academic Term runs from September - June. New students who register after September will have private lessons scheduled until August and will be honoured the Academic Term discounted rate.

No.

Is there a discount for siblings?

Yes! 10% off all group classes. \$50 maximum admin fee per household.

Do I have to take Music Theory Classes?

The short answer is no.

But, it is highly recommended to complement your music lesson with music theory as part of our Music Conservatory Program (see p.8). Certificates are awarded after completing each theory exam administered by The Royal Conservatory of Music.

Concerts

CW Performing Arts offers the opportunity for students to perform in a professional setting in front of a supportive audience of friends and family.

Concerts take place in December and June. Certificates and Special Awards are given to students at the end of each concert.

The concert stage is a place for students to gain confidence and share music, dance or other subjects that they have been studying during the Term.



Teachers will encourage performances at a CW Concert, but never force. A teacher has been in the shoes of their students and recognizes how stressful it can be to perform in front of an audience, yet the teacher also knows how important performances are in shaping their own music ability (and career) which is experience they pass on to their students. If a student opts out of performing in a concert, it would be beneficial for the student and the parent to at least be in attendance to be a part of the warmth that comes from watching performances in a welcoming environment.

Tickets

Our Program Tuition includes Concert Fees and therefore students receive 2 tickets per concert (total 4) per household. Additional tickets may be purchased subject to availability.

Students not enrolled in Programs may purchase tickets via our website as concert fees are not included in tuition.

Concert Fees & Tickets help our school cover costs to host concerts and concert productions, awards and administrative work.
